**RESEARCH & STANDARDS HEALTH REPORT**

Steve Smith, Research & Standards Health Unit, provided the following report:

1. On October 23, 2012 an advisory meeting will be held in Oakland in response to Petition 526 regarding occupational hazards related to housekeeping in hotels and the hospitality industry. 2. In response to a March 26, 2012 federal OSHA final rule <http://www.osha.gov/dsg/hazcom/index.html>, the Division developed a comprehensive update to section 5194. Hazard Communication along with 30+ other title 8 health standards regarding the Globally Harmonized System (GHS) of classifying and labeling chemicals. This large rulemaking package is anticipated to go to public hearing later this year and is intended to make the 30+ title 8 sections at least as effective as the new federal final rule. Early next year, we also anticipate developing a follow up rulemaking package and recommend possible changes to the Labor Code with regard to making any state unique statutes and regulations consistent with the new GHS requirements. 3. In response to Assembly Bill 1136 that went into effect this year regarding safe patient handling, a new Title 8 section is being developed with the assistance of an advisory committee. The advisory committee met in January and March of this year with at least one additional meeting to be possibly held later this year. 4. Bernard Impregilo Healy, JV – Compressed air work environment – variance application to escape requirement for automatic controls for decompression chamber under investigation.
5. Michels JayDee Coluccio JV – Compressed air work environment – variance application to escape requirement for automatic controls for decompression chamber under investigation.
6. Grimmway Farms – Experimental Variance in effect – study of alternative worker transportation methods continuing

**D. Crane Unit**

The Crane Unit has been busy conducting tower crane inspections and conducting permit conferences for the erection of new tower cranes. There are about 100 tower cranes operating in California. When the staff has not been inspecting tower cranes, they have been busy providing technical assistance. The Southern California group has been assisting with accident investigations and complaints.

The Southern California staff recently assisted the Los Angeles office with an accident investigation where a mobile crane was overloaded and flipped over into a construction pit.

Northern California staff also recently provided tech support to San Francisco District for overturn accident involving boom-type lift truck used in crane application.

Region 1 – 36 tower cranes up. 6 applications for the erection of tower cranes

Region 2 - 7 tower cranes, 2 applications for the erection of tower cranes.

Region 3 – 24 tower cranes , 5 applications for the erection of tower cranes.

## DOSH Advisory Committee-October 4, 2012

### Report on DOSH' Heat Special Emphasis Program (SEP) to date

- The DOSH Heat SEP, which had been updated and revised in May 2012, was implemented throughout the 2012 heat season in California
  - Utilizing a comprehensive strategy to ensure all workers in California are protected in their outdoor workplaces in numerous industries
  - Increasing consistency in field interpretation and enforcement
  - Combined strategies of targeted enforcement, outreach and education
  
- Overall evaluation:
  - DOSH continuing to devote a high level of resources to heat illness prevention: 4% more inspections in 2011 than 2010 and still compiling 2012 stats
  - Greater focus on strategic targeting of non-compliant employers as general levels of compliance continue to increase
  - Nonetheless, 2012 preliminary data highlights DOSH is still finding non-compliance in both the agricultural and, especially, construction industries.
  - Most frequent citations of the Heat Illness Prevention Standard:
    - Lack of written programs
    - Violations of High heat provisions
    - Lack of employee training
    - No access to water
  - More suspect heat-related fatalities in construction than agriculture in 2012 to date, but more suspect illness cases in ag than construction – all cases still under investigation
  
- Field implementation of the program this summer
  - All inspections of outdoor workplaces evaluated all aspects of employers' heat illness prevention programs
  - Coordinated inspections
    - Statewide Travel efforts (planned, geographic)
      - The Division has sent multiple teams of inspectors to over 27 different areas throughout the state, each team conducting enforcement activity for several days at a time.
      - Special focus of the Labor Enforcement Task Force on heat illness prevention in agriculture and construction during heat season – staff from DLSE accompanied DOSH inspectors
